Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Parishes everywhere have had to make significant adjustments to keep their doors open and parishioners safe. Thanks be to God that since we reopened our doors, we have been spared from any community-wide contagion. The threats of the pandemic still lurk around and we have to keep being our brothers' and sisters' keepers by abiding by the protocols set in place to help us stay open safely.

In a recent memo sent to the priests of the archdiocese, the Cardinal granted permission for parishes to gradually allow the different parish groups to resume their meetings within the facilities of the parish. Just as with the celebration of Mass and the sacraments in the church, this has to be done with the safety and wellbeing of all in mind. We will be communicating the guidelines, which we will be adopting for regulating group meetings here at Holy Family parish through the bulletin, announcements at Mass and the parish Facebook page.

Last week I received a letter from Cardinal DiNardo, in which he expresses his profound gratitude to our parish for our generous participation in this year's **DSF** campaign. The Diocesan Services Fund (DSF) is our way of uniting with our brothers and sisters in the work of charity, providing needed support to over 60 ministries of our archdiocese, which range from prison ministry, promoting vocation, and providing relief to those in need in all spheres of life.

The theme for this year's DSF is: **Bring Your Greatest Gifts to The Lord**. During periods of austerity, as is the case with the world now, charity and generosity takes a deeper dimension. Those who are able to share their resources to support works of charity in moments of trials truly demonstrate their trust in God's providence and their understanding of the call to love God and neighbor as well.

In today's Gospel, Jesus Christ sums the fulfillment of the commandment of God's law in love — a love that is primarily centered on God, and which finds its ordinary expression in charity to neighbors. "The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments". Let us daily endeavor to bring our *greatest gifts to the Lord* through acts of love for all.
