Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Around this time each year I am often asked about my opinion about the celebration of Halloween. In response, I try to underscore that Halloween is a contraction of "All Hallows' Eve", that is, the eve of All Saints' Day, which is celebrated on November 1. Interestingly, the verb "hallow" means to make holy, like when we pray in the *Our Father*, "hallowed be thy name!" We can reclaim the Christian roots of Halloween and keep this day *hallowed* by teaching our children of its connection with All Saints' Day, the heroic virtues of the saints, and encouraging them to imitate their exemplary Christian lives. After all, *all-hallows-eve* is about the saints!

Our tradition here at Holy Family is to pray for all the dead during the month of November. At the back of each church you will find the **Book of the Names of the Dead**. We are asking that you take a moment to write down the names of all your beloved dead so that we can remember them at mass throughout this month.

November 1 – 7 is **National Vocation Awareness Week**. Parents, this can be a wonderful opportunity to teach your children about Christian vocations. While encouragement about the priesthood and the Religious Life often take the center stage whenever the topic of vocation is being discussed, we must always keep in mind that every one of us has been given a vocation by God. As believers, we all share the universal call to holiness. This life of holiness and dedication to God takes different forms – the priesthood, the Religious Life, holy marriage and the single state – all, lived in accordance with God's will.

The Saints whose feast day we celebrate on All Saints' Day all answered God's particular call to them. Through their cooperation with the grace of God, they lived the best version of their lives, answering God's call to them. To promote vocations is to encourage all to discern God's call for them and to courageously accept his invitation.

By this time next week, we would have had the results of the presidential elections. The document, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, is a good resource material that has been provided by the Conference of Catholic Bishops to assist Catholics in their political responsibility. Please visit <u>www.usccb.org</u> if you would like to review this document. Let us pray for a safe and fair electoral process, and that our elected leaders will see their offices as avenues to carry out the will of God and not theirs.

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!
