Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Our Readings on this Second Sunday of Advent invites us to "prepare a way for the Lord". As part of our ongoing *Conversations with the Saints* series, we will be reflecting on excerpts on this theme from the **Commentary on Isaiah by Eusebius of Caesarea**; see below –

"The voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight the paths of our God. The prophecy makes clear that it is to be fulfilled, not in Jerusalem but in the wilderness: it is there that the glory of the Lord is to appear, and God's salvation is to be made known to all mankind.

It was in the wilderness that God's saving presence was proclaimed by John the Baptist, and there that God's salvation was seen. The words of this prophecy were fulfilled when Christ and his glory were made manifest to all: after his baptism the heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove rested on him, and the Father's voice was heard, bearing witness to the Son: *This is my beloved Son, listen to him.*

The prophecy meant that God was to come to a deserted place, inaccessible from the beginning. None of the pagans had any knowledge of God, since his holy servants and prophets were kept from approaching them. The voice commands that a way be prepared for the Word of God: the rough and trackless ground is to be made level, so that our God may find a highway when he comes. *Prepare the way of the Lord*: the way is the preaching of the Gospel, the new message of consolation, ready to bring to all mankind the knowledge of God's saving power.

Climb on a high mountain, bearer of good news to Zion. Lift up your voice in strength, bearer of good news to Jerusalem. These words harmonize very well with the meaning of what has gone before. They refer opportunely to the evangelists and proclaim the coming of God to men, after speaking of the voice crying in the wilderness. Mention of the evangelists suitably follows the prophecy on John the Baptist."

The proclamation of the Gospel throughout the ages is the ultimate preparation for the coming of the Lord. We are invited, therefore, to make a home for the Gospel message in our hearts and in turn, to share that Good News with all we meet by our lifestyle. Relying on God's grace, let us diligently identify and get rid of all obstacles to the Gospel message in order to prepare a home for God in our hearts.

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Mensaje del Pastor

"Una voz grita en el desierto: «Preparad un camino al Señor, allanad una calzada para nuestro Dios.» EL profeta declara abiertamente que su vaticinio no ha de realizarse en Jerusalén, sino en el desierto; a saber, que se manifestará la gloria del Señor, y la salvación de Dios llegará a conocimiento de todos los hombres.

Y todo esto, de acuerdo con la historia y a la letra, se cumplió precisamente cuando Juan Bautista predicó el advenimiento salvador de Dios en el desierto del Jordán, donde la salvación de Dios se dejó ver. Pues Cristo y su gloria se pusieron de manifiesto para todos cuando, una vez bautizado, se abrieron los cielos y el Espíritu Santo descendió en forma de paloma y se posó sobre él, mientras se oía la voz del Padre que daba testimonio de su Hijo: *Éste es mi Hijo, el amado; escuchadlo.*

Todo esto se decía porque Dios había de presentarse en el desierto, impracticable e inaccesible desde siempre. Se trataba, en efecto, de todas las gentes privadas del conocimiento de Dios, con las que no pudieron entrar en contacto los justos de Dios y los profetas.

Por este motivo, aquella voz manda preparar un camino para la Palabra de Dios, así como allanar sus obstáculos y asperezas, para que cuando venga nuestro Dios pueda caminar sin dificultad. *Preparad un camino al Señor*: se trata de la predicación evangélica y de la nueva consolación, con el deseo de que la salvación de Dios llegue a conocimiento de todos los hombres.

Súbete a un monte elevado, heraldo de Sión; alza fuerte la voz, heraldo de Jerusalén. Estas expresiones de los antiguos profetas encajan muy bien y se refieren con oportunidad a los evangelistas: ellas anuncian el advenimiento de Dios a los hombres, después de haberse hablado de la voz que grita en el desierto. Pues a la profecía de Juan Bautista sigue coherentemente la mención de los evangelistas.

La proclamación del Evangelio a lo largo de los siglos es la última preparación para la venida del Señor. Por lo tanto, se nos invita a hacer un hogar para el mensaje del Evangelio en nuestros corazones y, a su vez, a compartir esa Buena Nueva con todos los que encontramos por nuestro estilo de vida. Confiando en la gracia de Dios, identifiquemos diligentemente y eliminemos todos los obstáculos al mensaje del Evangelio a fin de preparar un hogar para Dios en nuestros corazones.

Somos una parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unidos en la alegría del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!

The word Advent comes from a the Latin advenio, "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare us for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered; to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the sacrament of Holy communion; as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ Second Coming at the end of time. Our preparations therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to receive Christ worthily. Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation. The season is a four-week preparation whose focus was on joyful celebration of the Lords incarnation.

The First Sunday is centered on the Lord's second coming; the Gloria is omitted as during Lent. So that on Christmas night the song of the angels may ring out anew in all its freshness. On the other hand, there is a clear note of joyful expectation: The Alleluia is retained before the Gospel. During this period, the priests wear purple vestments. The only exception is on third Sunday of Advent where the priest wear violet vestment (with rose as an option) known as Gaudete Sunday. During the first period of Advent, the readings from the prophet Isaiah continually speak of God's visitation. Consolation and redemption of His people, while the corresponding Gospel selections portray Christ as the fulfilment of the prophetic promises.

Remember Advent reminds us of sacred meaning of Christmas. This year it will start on 30th November and end on the fourth Sunday before 25th December. We are wishing you all a grace filled, prayerful filled 2020 Advent season!!!
