Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Let us welcome Fr. Allan Bower to our parish. Fr. Bower, who is associated with the Cross Catholic Outreach, will be the presenter for our English Lenten Retreat and Mission (March 1-3; see the bulletin for full details).

As most of you might remember, during the holy Seasons of Advent and Lent, we do a *Conversations with the Saints* series, where we reflect upon some of the writings of the saints about these liturgical seasons. We are resuming the practice this weekend with the following reflections by St. Peter Chrysologus on Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

There are three things, my brethren, by which faith stands firm, devotion remains constant, and virtue endures. They are prayer, fasting and mercy. Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives. Prayer, mercy and fasting: these three are one, and they give life to each other.

Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. Let no one try to separate them; they cannot be separated. If you have only one of them or not all together, you have nothing. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others you open God's ear to yourself.

When you fast, see the fasting of others. If you want God to know that you are hungry, know that another is hungry. If you hope for mercy, show mercy. If you look for kindness, show kindness. If you want to receive, give. If you ask for yourself what you deny to others, your asking is a mockery.

Let us use fasting to make up for what we have lost by despising others. Let us offer our souls in sacrifice by means of fasting. There is nothing more pleasing that we can offer to God, as the psalmist said in prophecy: A sacrifice to God is a broken spirit; God does not despise a bruised and humbled heart.

Offer your soul to God, make him an oblation of your fasting, so that your soul may be a pure offering, a holy sacrifice, a living victim, remaining your own and at the same time made over to God. Whoever fails to give this to God will not be excused, for if you are to give him yourself you are never without the means of giving.

To make these acceptable, mercy must be added. Fasting bears no fruit unless it is watered by mercy. Fasting dries up when mercy dries up. Mercy is to fasting as rain is to earth. However much you may cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, sow virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit.

When you fast, if your mercy is thin your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gather in by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others.

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Mensaje del Pastor

Queridos amados en Cristo:

Demos la bienvenida al P. Allan Bower a nuestra parroquia. P. Bower, quien está asociado con Cross Catholic Outreach, será el presentador de nuestro Retiro y Misión de Cuaresma en inglés (1-3 de marzo; consulte el boletín para obtener detalles completos).

Como la mayoría de ustedes recordarán, durante las temporadas santas de Adviento y Cuaresma, hacemos una serie de Conversaciones con los santos, donde reflexionamos sobre algunos de los escritos de los santos sobre estas temporadas litúrgicas. Reanudamos la práctica este fin de semana con las siguientes reflexiones de San Pedro Crisólogo sobre la oración, el ayuno y la limosna.

Hay tres cosas, hermanos míos, por las cuales la fe permanece firme, la devoción permanece constante y la virtud perdura. Son oración, ayuno y misericordia. La oración llama a la puerta, el ayuno obtiene, la misericordia recibe. Oración, misericordia y ayuno: estos tres son uno, y se dan vida el uno al otro.

El ayuno es el alma de la oración, la misericordia es el elemento vital del ayuno. Que nadie intente separarlos; no se pueden separar. Si solo tiene uno de ellos o no todos juntos, no tiene nada. Así que si rezas, ayuna; si ayunas, ten piedad; si quiere que su petición sea escuchada, escuche la petición de otros. Si no cierras tu oído a los demás, abres el oído de Dios a ti mismo.

Cuando ayunas, observa el ayuno de los demás. Si quieres que Dios sepa que tienes hambre, debes saber que otro tiene hambre. Si esperas misericordia, muéstralo. Si busca amabilidad, demuestre amabilidad. Si quieres recibir, da. Si te preguntas por ti mismo lo que niegas a los demás, lo que pides es una burla.

Usemos el ayuno para compensar lo que hemos perdido al despreciar a los demás. Ofrezcamos nuestras almas en sacrificio por medio del ayuno. No hay nada más agradable que podamos ofrecer a Dios, como dijo el salmista en la profecía: Un sacrificio a Dios es un espíritu quebrantado; Dios no desprecia un corazón herido y humillado.

Ofrece tu alma a Dios, haz de él una oblación de tu ayuno, para que tu alma sea una ofrenda pura, un sacrificio santo, una víctima viva, quedando tuya y al mismo tiempo entregada a Dios. Quien no le dé esto a Dios no será excusado, porque si usted va a darlo usted mismo, nunca estará sin los medios para dar.

Para hacerlos aceptables, se debe agregar misericordia. El ayuno no da fruto a menos que sea regado por la misericordia. El ayuno se seca cuando la misericordia se seca. La misericordia es el ayuno como la lluvia a la tierra. Por mucho que cultives tu corazón, limpies la tierra de tu naturaleza, arranques vicios, siembres virtudes, si no sueltas las fuentes de la misericordia, tu ayuno no dará fruto.

Cuando ayunes, si tu misericordia es escasa, tu cosecha será escasa; cuando ayunas, lo que derramas en misericordia se derrama en tu granero. Por tanto, no pierdas ahorrando, sino acumulando esparciendo. Da a los pobres y te das a ti mismo. No se le permitirá quedarse con lo que se ha negado a dar a otros.

Somos una parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unidos en la alegría del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!



Bet you didn't know that the Catholic Church is jam packed full of amazing free gifts. Let's start with the very best one: <u>JESUS HIMSELF</u>. Yes, absolutely right!!

Every single time you participate in Holy Mass, the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Beloved Lord Jesus Christ is right there on the altar, for every one of us to see and adore.

If you watch the priest carefully, early in the Consecration part of the Mass, he will place the bread and wine on the altar in front of himself.

See Column 2 on right

THEN the priest, with his hands hovering over them, will say, "And so, Father, we bring you these gifts. We ask you to make them holy by the power of your Spirit, that they may become the body and blood of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, at whose command we celebrate this Eucharist."

Father then makes the Sign of the Cross over the original bread and wine, and then says the words of Jesus identifying it as His Body and Blood. A major change has just happened: a "change of substance" from bread and wine, into the body and blood of Christ! Jesus We call that change Transubstantiation, which means substance of the bread and wine elements change; but the accidental qualities--sight, taste, smell, touch--do not change. This means that the substance is now JESUS HIMSELF.

Holy Family Parish Council:

Prologue: In accord with Canon 536 of the Code of Canon Law, a parish pastoral council is to be established in each parish. It is a collaborative body of the Christian faithful whose purpose is the promotion of the mission of Jesus Christ and His Church in its entirety.

Pope Paul IV stated that the pastoral council is "to examine and consider all that relates to pastoral work and to offer practical conclusions on these matters, so that the life and activity of the People of God be brought into great conformity with the Gospel."

Purpose: The Pastoral Council is a consultative body consisting of representative members of the parish who form one body with the pastor in fulfilling the Church's ministry. The council through its insights and advice helps the pastor identify, implement, and evaluate pastoral initiatives and policies best suited to spread the Gospel. The Council is the means to bring life and service to the parish community. They share responsibility with the pastor for the spiritual and maternal growth and well-being of the parish. The Pastoral Council does not function independently of the pastor.

Membership: The Pastoral Council members reflect the diverse parish community including racial, ethnic, gender, and age diversity, economic and occupational diversity, and geographic diversity.

Committees: The council may form committees as needed to provide feedback to its members.

Meetings: Regular scheduled meetings are held on the 4th Wednesday of each month. Scheduled meetings may change from time to time if voted at the previous meetings.

Feedback to Council: Parishioners may contact members of the Council with their ideas, issues, or concerns. Parishioners may also use this e-mail shepherdhfp@gmail.com to bring forth any concerns or questions to Father Jude and the Pastoral Council. Your concerns or issues will remain anonymous to Council members. We will respond to you via your e-mail after our Council meeting.





Provide us with the grace to hear and respond to his voice, to look at the world's brokenness and not feel despair, but see your promise that all the world shall be transfigured by your love. Allow us to be transfigured to do what you will, that we might use the life we have been given to glorify you. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Glimpses of Glory

Today's readings: Genesis 22:1–2, 9a, 10–13, 15–18; Psalm 116:10, 15, 16–17, 18–19; Romans 8:31b–34; Mark 9:2–10. After Jesus first predicts that he will suffer, he takes Peter, James, and John apart from everyone else. These apostles see Jesus in his glory, in gleaming clothing with Moses and Elijah, whose presence communicates that Jesus is the fulfillment of the law and the prophets. Then the apostles hear a voice from heaven, saying, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." As quickly as the vision appears, it ceases.

As conflicts arose between Jesus and the leaders of the day, the apostles may have taken comfort in knowing that Jesus is God's "beloved Son." Walking through the passion with Jesus, they could cling to the glimpse of Jesus' glory. The words beloved Son also may have called to mind for them the sacrifice of Isaac. Abraham had been obedient to God and had not withheld his beloved son. Abraham knew God and, therefore, knew that God is a keeper of promises. Somehow, even when it seemed impossible, God's promise would be fulfilled. Abraham would be the father of many through Isaac. He believed in God's promise, even when it seemed that the promise could not be kept. In this moment we see another prefiguration of what is to come, the impossible hope that endures through Good Friday and is vindicated on Easter morning.

Where have you glimpsed resurrection? How can you hold to these moments in your times of trial?


