Message from the Pastor

Mensaje del Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Easter is the season of hope and new life! Each year, this sacred time calls us in a special way to keep our focus on what is most important – the gift of everlasting life with God and His invitation to us to daily embrace this new life in hope.

Speaking of newness, we are all aware of the multifaceted changes that the pandemic has ushered into every sphere of human activities – most of which have been very difficult to navigate, to say the least. In particular, interpersonal communication have had to give way to virtual/ digital forms, which in some cases have further distanced individuals and communities. We see this played out in churches/places of worship, schools, workplaces, etc.

In addition, the increase in digital forms of communication have also witnessed a rising surge in digital scams and fraudulent actions. Particularly, I am speaking in reference to **imposter priest email and texting scams**. We continue to receive numerous reports of individuals who are impersonating priests and soliciting donations – mostly in the form of gift cards – from parishioners. These fraudulent requests come mostly through emails and text messages.

The sad reality is that this is a national crisis. The impostors try to trick unsuspecting parishioners by asking them to buy gift cards for a false charitable cause. Not too long ago, Ken Paxton, the Attorney General of Texas issued a Consumer Alert to create greater awareness of this problem: "All Texans should be aware of unsolicited calls and texts from scammers impersonating leaders in their Church. This is a dirty trick criminals are using to make a quick buck at the expense of people of faith," he said.

Please be advised that priests would never make such requests, asking you to purchase gift cards – or the likes – for some charitable cause, nor would the parish ask you for such. We encourage you to always verify when you receive financial solicitations, which claim to be coming from the parish or the priest. And if you do receive any unfamiliar donations requests, please always contact the parish office.

Here at Holy Family parish, we do our best to communicate via the parish bulletin, our Facebook page, parish website, Flocknote and through the announcements we make in church. We encourage you to rely primarily on these sources to stay connected with our parish family.

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Queridos amados en Cristo:

¡La Pascua es el tiempo de la esperanza y la vida nueva! Cada año, este tiempo sagrado nos llama de una manera especial a mantener nuestro enfoque en lo más importante: el regalo de la vida eterna con Dios y su invitación a abrazar diariamente esta nueva vida con esperanza.

Hablando de novedad, todos somos conscientes de los cambios multifacéticos que la pandemia ha introducido en todas las esferas de las actividades humanas, la mayoría de las cuales han sido muy difíciles de transitar, por decir lo mínimo. En particular, la comunicación interpersonal ha tenido que dar paso a formas virtuales / digitales, que en algunos casos han distanciado aún más a los individuos y las comunidades. Vemos que esto se desarrolla en iglesias / lugares de culto, escuelas, lugares de trabajo, etc.

Además, el aumento de las formas digitales de comunicación también ha sido testigo de un aumento en las estafas digitales y acciones fraudulentas. En particular, me refiero a las estafas de mensajes de texto y correos electrónicos de sacerdotes impostores. Seguimos recibiendo numerosos informes de personas que se hacen pasar por sacerdotes y solicitan donaciones, principalmente en forma de tarjetas de regalo, de los feligreses. Estas solicitudes fraudulentas provienen principalmente de correos electrónicos y mensajes de texto.

La triste realidad es que se trata de una crisis nacional. Los impostores intentan engañar a los feligreses desprevenidos pidiéndoles que compren tarjetas de regalo para una causa benéfica falsa. No hace mucho, Ken Paxton, el Procurador General de Texas emitió una Alerta al Consumidor para crear una mayor conciencia de este problema: "Todos los tejanos deben estar al tanto de las llamadas y los mensajes de texto no solicitados de estafadores que se hacen pasar por líderes en su Iglesia. Este es un truco sucio que los criminales están usando para ganar dinero rápido a expensas de las personas de fe ", dijo.

Tenga en cuenta que los sacerdotes nunca harían tales solicitudes, pidiéndole que compre tarjetas de regalo, o similares, para alguna causa benéfica, ni la parroquia se las pediría. Lo alentamos a verificar siempre cuando reciba solicitudes financieras, que afirman provenir de la parroquia o el sacerdote. Y si recibe solicitudes de donaciones con las que no está familiarizado, comuníquese siempre con la oficina parroquial.

Aquí, en la parroquia Holy Family, hacemos todo lo posible para comunicarnos a través del boletín parroquial, nuestra página de Facebook, el sitio web de la parroquia, Flocknote y los anuncios que hacemos en la iglesia. Lo alentamos a que confíe principalmente en estas fuentes para mantenerse conectado con nuestra familia parroquial.

Somos una parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unidos en el gozo del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!

Mary and the Month of May

Did you know that the month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary? Why would the Church dedicate a month to her? What is so special about this lady in blue? Whenever St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) was asked this sort of question, she had a quick and easy response: "No Mary, no Jesus." and this is absolutely the case. In the infancy narrative of Jesus Christ in the Gospel of Luke, we read the account of Mary's cooperation with God's plan. God asked Mary for permission to bear His Son, Jesus Christ, and we remember this moment on the Feast of the Annunciation, celebrated on March 25th (9 months before Christmas). In Luke 1:28, Mary said, "yes" to the angel Gabriel, and ultimately to God, to help bring about the salvation of the world. Jesus needed a mother and Mary was chosen for this role.

In early May, Catholic churches all over the world will celebrate the Crowning of Mary, in which we honor her title as Queen of Heaven and Earth. This very simple young maiden, who became the mother of Jesus Christ, would ultimately become the queen of all. We know that Mary, through her "yes" not only became the mother of Christ but was also saying yes to so much more, to being our own spiritual mother. In

the Gospel of John, Jesus, in the midst of His painful crucifixion, gives us such a precious gift. He gives us His mother. In John 19:26-27, Jesus says to Mary "Woman, behold your son!" and to John, the beloved disciple, "Behold, your mother!". In this moment, Jesus is giving us His mother as our own. We can turn to her in our time of need, especially through our praying of the Memorare.

REMEMBER, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, I fly to thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother; to thee do I come; before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

Pear of OSt. Soseph Indulgences

Granted by the Holy See from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021

Below is a summary of how you can receive the special indulgences granted by the Holy See for the Year of St. Joseph.

The plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of Saint Joseph on the occasions and in the manner indicated by this Apostolic Penitentiary:

- Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Our Father
- Participate in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on Saint Joseph
- Perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy
- Recite the Holy Rosary in families and between the husband and wife
- Entrust their work daily to the protection of Saint Joseph and to all believers who invoke with their prayers the intercession of the worker of Nazareth
- Pray the <u>Litany of Saint Joseph</u> in its entirety or at least part of it (for the Byzantine tradition), or some other prayer to Saint Joseph, typical of the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church and for the relief of all persecuted Christians
- Pray any lawfully approved prayer or act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph, for example, "To you oh blessed Joseph," especially on:
 - March 19th (Solemnity of St. Joseph)
 - May 1st (Feast of St. Joseph the Worker)
 - December 26th (Feast of the Holy Family)
 - The Sunday of Saint Joseph (according to the Byzantine tradition)
 - The 19th day of every month
 - Every Wednesday (a day dedicated to the memory of the Saint according to the Latin tradition)

The gift of plenary indulgence extends particularly to —

- The elderly
- The sick
- The dying
- All those who for legitimate reasons cannot leave their home

— who, with the spirit detached from any sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions, in your own home or wherever the impediment holds you, pray an act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph, consolation of the sick and patron of good death, confidently offering God the pains and difficulties of his life.
