Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

The Curé d'Ars, St. Jean-Baptiste Marie Vianney, was a holy priest and a great confessor. As a priest, he would spend many hours before Christ present in the Holy Eucharist, which in turn helped him greatly in administering God's mercy and healing through the Sacrament of Confession. In addition to the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass, we are also blessed with the opportunity of spending time with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through our participation in **Eucharistic Adoration/ Exposition** and **Benediction**.

Before the Pandemic, we would have Adoration of the Holy Eucharist from Tuesday, starting immediately after the morning Mass and ending with the celebration of **Benediction** at 5:30 PM the following day. My hope for Holy Family Parish is that we are able to have **Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration**, where the Blessed Sacrament is exposed all the time for adoration, worship and prayer. We can do this but we have to gradually work toward this goal.

Parishes with Perpetual Adoration flourish immensely. Just as the sun brings life and vitality wherever it shines, even more so the brilliance and grace of God envelope and animate all those who come to adore Christ present in the Most Holy Eucharist of the altar.

Come! Jesus awaits you in the Most Holy Eucharist. He invites you and waits patiently for you to come and spend some time with him. As Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen remarked, "The only time our Lord asked the Apostles for anything was the night he went into agony. Not for activity but for an hour of companionship" (see **Matthew 26:40**). Our Lord waits for us lovingly and he wants to accompany us more intimately throughout life. As we spend more time in his presence we grow more in his likeness.

Right now, Eucharistic Adoration takes place only Wednesdays at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Chapel; we would like to go back to our pre-pandemic schedule (i.e. Tuesday morning – Wednesday evening) and hopefully get to the point where we can have Perpetual Adoration on the island. After each Mass this weekend, members of our parish Evangelization and Stewardship Committee will be standing outside to sign up new adorers. We hope you will sign up for a date with Jesus. Come, he awaits you with open and loving arms in the Holy Eucharist!

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Mensaje del Pastor

Queridos amados en Cristo:

El Cura de Ars, San Juan Bautista María Vianney, fue un santo sacerdote y un gran confesor. Como sacerdote, pasaba muchas horas ante Cristo presente en la Sagrada Eucaristía, lo que a su vez lo ayudó enormemente a administrar la misericordia de Dios y la curación a través del Sacramento de la Confesión. Además del Sacrificio de la Santa Misa, también somos bendecidos con la oportunidad de pasar tiempo con nuestro Señor y Salvador Jesucristo a través de nuestra participación en la **Adoración / Exposición y Bendición Eucarística.**

Antes de la pandemia, tendríamos la Adoración de la Sagrada Eucaristía desde el martes, comenzando inmediatamente después de la Misa de la mañana y terminando con la celebración de la **Bendición** a las 5:30 PM del día siguiente. 
LAYING A STRONG FOUNDATION FOR THE CATHOLIC FAITH

Faith will be the foundation of your life. Make that Foundation solid!

Go slowly, make sure you've developed the basics well.

That will help you avoid discouragement and frustration,

two big enemies of faith development.



Sometimes it seems like it takes a long time to work through all of the Catholic RCIA stages. But..... **DON'T RUSH IT!**

- **RCIA Stage 1 Just Looking**: In the **inquiry** stage, you're just finding out about Jesus, Christianity and the Catholic Church. Your main task here is to explore and develop your faith enough so you can make an informed *initial* decision about entering the Catholic Church. The final decision won't come for a long time, when you actually enter the Church at Easter and receive the sacraments of initiation.
- **RCIA Stage 2 Learning about the Faith**: Now you need to learn and grow more. You focus on **catechesis** in this stage: learning about the faith, how to live as a Christian, and developing your interior life. Your job now is to come into closer contact with the Living God and learn more about the Catholic Faith.
- **RCIA Stage 3 Getting ready for rebirth!**: This period of **purification and enlightenment** is the final stage before receiving the Easter sacraments of initiation into the Church; baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. (Those already baptized with a valid baptism in another Christian church aren't baptized again.) This stage of intense **reflection** calls you to deeper conversion in preparation for your renewal at Easter. This is what the season of Lent is for, but it has a special intensity for you this year as you're entering the Church and receiving the sacraments of initiation.
- **RCIA Stage 4 Reflecting on the mysteries of the Mass**: This Stage of **Mystagogy** during Easter is the continued reflection on the sacraments you have received at Easter, especially the Eucharist. The Mass and the Eucharist are the "source and summit" of the Christian life in the Catholic Church, and this period is designed to help you understand, appreciate, and live more deeply this center of Catholicism.

Remember that the catholic RCIA stages are a good model of basic faith development, so you can learn a lot from them even if you're not in the RCIA process.

WHO FOUNDED THE CATHOLIC CHURCH?

Jesus founded the Catholic church. The New Testament Shows that Christ deliberately created a community of disciples to carry on his mission in the world. This community is the Catholic Church, which has existed since the time of Christ and the Apostles.

The HFP Gift Store is located in the Parish Life Center at St. Patrick's and is available to the public: Sundays from 8:30 AM - 12 PM




