# Message from the Pastor

#### Dearly Beloved in Christ:

We welcome Sr. Juliana Asuzo, HHCJ and Sr. Emilia Ogar, HHCJ to our parish family! Sr. Juliana will be joining our Holy Family School staff as the new teacher for **Pre-K**. Sr. Emilia is our new Coordinator of Family Life and Pastoral Ministries. We have included their short autobiographies and portraits on page **9** for your quick reference.

Sr. Juliana and Sr. Emilia, together with Sr. Betty, are members of the congregation of the **Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus (HHCJ)**. The congregation was founded by Mother Mary Charles Magdalen Walker, a Religious Sister of Charity, who came to Nigeria in 1923 at the invitation of Bishop Joseph Shanahan (CSSP) of the Vicariate of Southern Nigeria.

After many years of dedicated service and with the efforts of the founding members, the congregation received its official canonical recognition in 1937. And by God's grace, their ministry has grown tremendously and they have established convents in Nigeria, Ghana, Cameroon, Togo, Sierra Leone, Kenya, Italy, England, Germany, Canada, Grenada, as well as the United State of America.

For over twenty-two years now, the HHCJ congregation have been a part of our archdiocese. They have three convents in the greater Houston area and an additional one here in our parish at the Sacred Heart rectory. Our local church continues to enjoy the great contributions and pastoral presence of consecrated men and women religious.

Galveston, in particular, has had a rich influx of religious sisters, brothers and priests who have left their mark in the annals of our local history. The Ursulines, the Dominicans, the sisters of Charity of the Incarnate Word, the Holy Family sisters, priests of the Society of the Divine Word, The Josephites (i.e. the Society of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart) and – most recently – the Franciscan friars, to mention but a few, have all served the faithful in Galveston as ministers of God's graces.

The sisters of the Handmaid of the Holy Child Jesus are, in essence, carrying on the baton of the great missionary and pastoral presence of all the religious men and women who have graced the island of Galveston. We are glad to have them with us; we welcome them, and pray that their ministry be fruitful, engaging, inspiring and refreshing.

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Children's Catechumenate – RCIC – Rite of Christian Initiation of Children who have Reached Catechetical Age. (7 years old or older)

This is a two-year program (process) for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason, are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

The Children will attend weekly age- appropriate classes and parents will attend Sacrament Preparation Meetings periodically as required. The candidates will celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) at the Easter vigil of their second year.

The First year (stage) of the faith journey is called the inquiry. Classes are centered on God, and God's love. They cover basic questions in the areas of Catholic Belief, Mass, the Bible, saints, prayer, and practices. This is a time for inquires to learn the ways Catholics worship together and how they bring their Christian faith to life. This stage culminates with the commitment to enter the catechumenate, to prepare for entrance into full membership with the Catholic Church.

The second year (stage) of classes emphasizes the child's relationship with God, and their families within the body of Christ, the Church. The process will continue with the Catechumenate, Lent and Mystagogy stages. A sponsor accompanies the child on his/her journey. All sponsors must fulfill Diocesan requirements.

- Registration for first year (stage) requires to fill out registration form
- Registration for second year, requires to fill out registration forms and bring a copy of your child's birth certificate.

During the two years, special sessions are held to help children, families, sponsors prepare for the celebration of the Sacraments of initiation, and parents are required to attend mandatory parent session and retreat.

The celebration of the Sacraments of initiation takes place during the Easter Vigil of the second year. The Candidates then begin a period of reflection on the initiation process called mystagogy where they reflect on the sacraments celebrated and continue to grow in their faith.



Weekly classes are in Room 2 of the Parish Life Center at the St. Patrick premises (located in the old school building). You can pass through the double doors in the middle of the building to enter.



On September 14th, we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross which God used as the instrument of our salvation.

The mother of emperor Constantine went in search of the Cross of Jesus in order to secure and preserve this holy relic which had been soaked in Christ's blood and used to save us from sin and death. Upon finding 3 crosses, they did not know which was the true cross... so they brought a woman who was near death and only one Cross raised her miraculously to good health. It was the Cross of Jesus.

In the old testament, Moses was commanded to create a bronze serpent so that by his obedience and the faith of the people, all who looked on it would be healed from the serpent's bite. So now, in all our churches, we have lifted up the cross of Christ as a daily reminder of the great love of God which has ransomed us for eternal life.


