Dearly Beloved in Christ:

January 22 marks the 49th anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in Roe v. Wade. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has designated January 22 as a National Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn. To commemorate this day, the archdiocesan Offices of Pro-Life Activities and Worship hosted a morning of prayer earlier on today at the Co-Cathedral, beginning with a time of Adoration, reflection and prayer from 8:30 – 10:30a.m., followed by Mass celebrated by Cardinal DiNardo.

Here in our parish, we are inviting all to join in praying for the legal protection of the unborn by attending any weekday Mass (of your choice, this week) and to spend some time in the presence of Christ during our weekly Exposition and Adoration, which takes place from Tuesday (immediately after the 7:00 am. Mass) to Wednesday (and ends with Benediction at 5:30 PM, in the Chapel of Our Lady of Guadalupe).

We know that the issue of abortion is very polarizing in our society, including within the walls of the Church. As believers we look to the Word of God for direction and light in all matters, no least in the issue of the sanctity of human life from natural conception to natural death. That God is intimately involved in the marvelous formation and creation of human life is attested to in Scriptures. God, speaking through the Prophet Jeremiah, says: Before I formed you in the womb I knew you (Jer. 1:5; emphases added).

Abortion is a usurpation of the sovereign power of God over the creation of human life. As such, it is intrinsically evil when it is sought in itself and for the sole purpose of terminating the natural process of the formation of human life.

In our Second Reading today, Saint Paul eloquently reminds us that we are members of the mystical Body of Christ; therefore, "If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy". Abortion – and indeed, every forms of indignities against the sanctity of human life from natural conception to natural death (such as human/sex trafficking, social injustice, violence, systemic racism, the unjust distribution of the world's resources, etc.) is an affront against our common humanity.

As members of the body of Christ, let us unite in promoting the Gospel of Life by accepting/living by the truth, speaking up against the lies, and praying that people everywhere will seek to embrace God's will and sovereignty over all of human life.

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

El 22 de enero marca el 49.º aniversario de la decisión de la Corte Suprema en Roe v. Wade. La Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB) ha designado el 22 de enero como Día Nacional de Oración por la Protección Legal del No Nacido. Para conmemorar este día, las Oficinas Arquidiocesanas de Actividades Pro-Vida y Adoración organizaron una mañana de oración hoy en la Concatedral, comenzando con un tiempo de Adoración, reflexión y oración de 8:30 a 10:30 a.m., seguida de la Misa celebrada por el Cardenal DiNardo.

Aquí en nuestra parroquia, estamos invitando a todos a unirse en oración por la protección legal de los no nacidos asistiendo a cualquier Misa de lunes a viernes (de su elección, esta semana) y a pasar algún tiempo en la presencia de Cristo durante nuestra Exposición y Adoración semanal, que se lleva a cabo desde el martes (inmediatamente después de la Misa de las 7:00 am) hasta el miércoles (y termina con la Bendición a las 5:30 pm, en la Capilla de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe). Sabemos que el tema del aborto está muy polarizado en nuestra sociedad, incluso dentro de los muros de la Iglesia. Como creyentes, buscamos en la Palabra de Dios dirección y luz en todos los asuntos, sobre todo en el tema de la santidad de la vida humana desde la concepción natural hasta la muerte natural. Que Dios está íntimamente involucrado en la maravillosa formación y creación de la vida humana está atestiguado en las Escrituras. Dios, hablando por medio del profeta Jeremías, dice: Antes que te formase en el vientre te conocí (Jeremías 1:5; cursiva agregada).

El aborto es una usurpación del poder soberano de Dios sobre la creación de la vida humana. Como tal, es intrínsecamente mala cuando se busca en sí misma y con el único fin de poner fin al proceso natural de formación de vida humana. la En nuestra Segunda Lectura de hoy, San Pablo nos recuerda elocuentemente que somos miembros del Cuerpo místico de Cristo; por tanto, "Si una parte sufre, todas las partes sufren con ella; si una parte es honrada, todas las partes comparten su alegría". El aborto, y de hecho, toda forma de indignidad contra la santidad de la vida humana desde la concepción natural hasta la muerte natural (como el tráfico sexual/humano, la injusticia social, la violencia, el racismo sistémico, la distribución injusta de los recursos del mundo, etc.) es una afrenta contra nuestra humanidad común. Como miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, unámonos para promover el Evangelio de la Vida aceptando/viviendo la verdad, hablando en contra de las mentiras y orando para que las personas en todas partes busquen abrazar la voluntad y la soberanía de Dios sobre toda la vida humana.

Somos una parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unidos en la alegría del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!

BE RECONCILED

"In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace" (Ephesians 1:7). Through the blood of Christ, we are cleansed of our sins and we can confidently call God, Father. Our sins do not stop us from being the children of God. We are forever God's children and He loves us all no matter our wrong doings. However, our sins prevent us from experiencing the inflow of God's love and graces in our lives.

God's arms are always open to welcome us when we return to Him through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. "Anyone whose sins you forgive are forgiven and anyone whose sins you retain, are retained" (John 20:23). The priest does not sit at the confessional to listen to my confession on his own, he represents Christ as he acts in persona Christi; that is, he acts in the person of Christ. Jesus Christ is the one who listens to us and has the power to wash away our sins through the power of the Holy Spirit. The priest is only a representative of Christ Jesus our Lord.

Let us take our spiritual life more seriously and always think about our relationship with God. It is a new year. A year God has gladly and mercifully allowed us to see; not because we merit it or anything special we have done, but because He loves us and wants us to always be happy in this life and in the next life with Him. We have to think about confession at least once a month for our good and for a better relationship with our God and creator and our brothers and sisters as well.

No one knows the day, time, or hour when the Lord will come. If we knew, we would know what to make of our lives, but since that is known to God alone, then we have to work towards that day by making sure we are on the right path with God. Saint Paul advises us to work out our salvation with fear and trembling (See: Philippians 2:12).

According to Pope Francis, the Church should always be a place of mercy and hope, where everyone is welcomed, loved and forgiven, and that is truly the intention of Jesus Christ whose body we are. So, it is important to reconcile with myself, with God, and with others as often as possible. So, go to confession and be renewed in mind and body, and be happy!
