Dearly Beloved in Christ:

What an amazing St. Patrick's Day Festival! Thank you all for coming out to fellowship and for your continued support of our parish. As pastor, I am immensely grateful to the members of the St. Patrick's Festival Committee, individuals, parish groups, local businesses and countless individuals through whose generosity we were able to host a successful festival. May God bless you abundantly, amen!

This week's **Conversations with the Saints** series centers on St. Augustine's reflection on Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well (see: **John 4:5-42**) –

"A woman came. She is a symbol of the Church not yet made righteous but about to be made righteous. Righteousness follows from the conversation. She came in ignorance, she found Christ, and he enters into conversation with her. ... The Samaritans did not form part of the Jewish people: they were foreigners. The fact that she came from a foreign people is part of the symbolic meaning, for she is a symbol of the Church. The Church was to come from the Gentiles, of a different race from the Jews. ...

Jesus says to her: Give me water to drink. For his disciples had gone to the city to buy food. The Samaritan woman therefore says to him: How is it that you, though a Jew, ask me for water to drink, though I am a Samaritan woman? For Jews have nothing to do with Samaritans.

The Samaritans were foreigners; Jews never used their utensils. The woman was carrying a pail for drawing water. She was astonished that a Jew should ask her for a drink of water, a thing that Jews would not do. But the one who was asking for a drink of water was thirsting for her faith. ...

He asks for a drink, and he promises a drink. He is in need, as one hoping to receive, yet he is rich, as one about to satisfy the thirst of others. He says: *If you knew the gift of God*. The gift of God is the Holy Spirit. But he is still using veiled language as he speaks to the woman and gradually enters into her heart. Or is he already teaching her? What could be more gentle and kind than the encouragement he gives? *If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, "Give me a drink," perhaps you might ask and he would give you living water.*

What is this water that he will give if not the water spoken of in Scripture: With you is the fountain of life? How can those feel thirst who will drink deeply from the abundance in your house? He was promising the Holy Spirit in satisfying abundance. ..."

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Mensaje del Pastor

La serie **Conversaciones con los Santos** de esta semana se centra en la reflexión de San Agustín sobre el encuentro de Jesús con la mujer junto al pozo (ver: **Juan 4:5-42**) –

"Llega una mujer. Se trata aquí de una figura de la Iglesia, no santa aún, pero sí a punto de serlo; de esto, en efecto, habla nuestra lectura. La mujer llegó sin saber nada, encontró a Jesús, y él se puso a hablar con ella. ... Los samaritanos no tenían nada que ver con los judíos; no eran del pueblo elegido. Y esto ya significa algo: aquella mujer, que representaba a la Iglesia, era una extranjera, porque la Iglesia iba a ser constituida por gente extraña al pueblo de Israel. ...

Jesús le dice: «Dame de beber». Sus discípulos se habían ido al pueblo a comprar comida. La samaritana le dice: ¿Cómo tú, siendo judío, me pides de beber a mí, que soy samaritana? Porque los judíos no se tratan con los samaritanos."

Ved cómo se trata aquí de extranjeros: los judíos no querían ni siquiera usar sus vasijas. Y como aquella mujer llevaba una vasija para sacar el agua, se asombró de que un judío le pidiera de beber, pues no acostumbraban a hacer esto los judíos. Pero aquel que le pedía de beber tenía sed, en realidad, de la fe de aquella mujer. ...

Fíjate en quién era aquel que le pedía de beber: Jesús le contestó: «*Si conocieras el don de Dios, y quién es el que te pide de beber, le pedirías tú, y él te daría agua viva.»* Le pedía de beber, y fue él mismo quien prometió darle el agua. Se presenta como quien tiene indigencia, como quien espera algo, y le promete abundancia, como quien está dispuesto a dar hasta la saciedad. Si conocieras —dice— el don de Dios. El don de Dios es el Espíritu Santo. A pesar de que no habla aún claramente a la mujer, ya va penetrando, poco a poco, en su corazón y ya la está adoctrinando. ¿Podría encontrarse algo más suave y más bondadoso que esta exhortación? Si conocieras el don de Dios, y quién es el que te pide de beber, le pedirías tú, y él te daría agua viva.

¿De qué agua iba a darle, sino de aquella de la que está escrito: En ti está la fuente viva? Y ¿cómo podrán tener sed los que se nutren de lo sabroso de tu casa? De manera que le estaba ofreciendo un manjar apetitoso y la saciedad del Espíritu Santo...."

Somos una Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unida en el gozo del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!

Lent is a liturgical season that focuses on the three pillars of prayer. fasting and almsgiving. The 40 days' journey of Lent begins from Ash Wednesday and ends with Holy week. Lent is a time for sacrifice and spiritual reflection preparing us for the joyful celebration of Easter Sunday.

A classical way of looking at the 40days of lent is consecrating our journey back to God and acknowledging that periodically we get off the track. But we got a person to show us the way- OUR LORD AND SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST who said " I am the way, the truth and the life" If we want to find our journey back to God is to go directly to Jesus who is the way.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) has an excellent way as it has become part of the tradition through RICEBOWL. That allows us to pray, it allows an act of sacrifice as we put in something at the RICE BOWL in the cost of giving up something, it allows us to do an act of love and service to charity to someone else.

Lent is the time we admit with all the humility and sincerity that we can muster that life is a journey back to God. Periodically, we get lost. The best way to return is through Jesus. Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving are the best compose back to God.

LORD HELP ME CHANGE MY WAYS

Lent is not about me, it is about God. Lent reminds me of all that God the Father endured when He willingly allowed His only son Jesus to save humanity. What a shameful death for a sinner like me, which Christ endured in love for our salvation. Again, Lent is not about me, it is about God and his son Jesus Christ. Since God has spared my life to experience another Lent, I am called by the Church to change my lifestyle, especially some bad habits that I know within me that if God were to come down and stay a night in my home, he will not be happy with me. Think about it, what are those things that I do almost daily that make me uncomfortable with myself? The things I wish I never started and now I find myself unable to let go.

This is Lent, a time to examine my life and drop bad habits. Habits that I regret and which cause me shame; sinful habits against the love of God. We can do it. A little self denial and self control can help us fight bad habits. Remember, with God nothing is impossible (see Luke 1:37). As we journey with Christ who, "though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness" (Philippians 2:6-7), and suffered a humiliating death to give us life. Let us think about our lives this Lent; mortify our flesh and join our sufferings to Christ's who did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life for all of us.

Dear friends, let us think about those bad habits that we know deep within our hearts are displeasing in the eyes of God and repent from them. Let us surrender our struggles before the merciful love of God, remembering that "God's power is made perfect in our weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).
