#### Dearly Beloved in Christ:

The 4th Sunday of Lent is also known as *Laetare Sunday* because on this day, the Church rejoices, for our redemption is close at hand! This is conveyed in the liturgical mood as on this Sunday, the color rose or violet may be used, instrumental music is permitted and the altar may be decorated with flowers.

This week's **Conversations with the Saints** series is from an Easter Letter by the Bishop, St. Athanasius –

"The Word who became all things for us is close to us, our Lord Jesus Christ who promises to remain with us always. He cries out, saying: *See, I am with you all the days of this age...* In the same way, he has come among us as our feast and holy day as well... It was Christ who shed his light on the psalmist as he prayed: *You are my joy, deliver me from those surrounding me.* True joy, genuine festival, means the casting out of wickedness. To achieve this one must live a life of perfect goodness and, in the serenity of the fear of God, practice contemplation in one's heart.

This was the way of the saints, who in their lifetime and at every stage of life rejoiced as at a feast. Blessed David, for example, not once but seven times rose at night to win God's favor through prayer. The great Moses was full of joy as he sang God's praises in hymns of victory for the defeat of Pharaoh and the oppressors of the Hebrew people. Others had hearts filled always with gladness as they performed their sacred duty of worship, like the great Samuel and the blessed Elijah. Because of their holy lives they gained freedom, and now keep festival in heaven. They rejoice after their pilgrimage in shadows, and now distinguish the reality from the promise.

When we celebrate the feast in our own day, what path are we to take? As we draw near to this feast, who is to be our guide? Beloved, it must be none other than the one whom you will address with me as our Lord Jesus Christ...

In former times the blood of goats and the ashes of a calf were sprinkled on those who were unclean, but they were able to purify only the body. Now through the grace of God's Word everyone is made abundantly clean. If we follow Christ closely we shall be allowed, even on this earth, to stand as it were on the threshold of the heavenly Jerusalem, and enjoy the contemplation of that everlasting feast, like the blessed apostles, who in following the Savior as their leader, showed, and still show, the way to obtain the same gift from God. They said: *See, we have left all things and followed you*. We too follow the Lord, and we keep his feast by deeds rather than by words."

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

## Mensaje del Pastor

#### Amados en Christo:

El cuarto domingo de Cuaresma también se conoce como Domingo Laetare porque en este día, la Iglesia se regocija, iporque nuestra redención está cerca! Esto se transmite en el estado de ánimo litúrgico ya que en este domingo se puede usar el color rosa o violeta, se permite la música instrumental y se puede decorar el altar con flores.

La serie *Conversaciones con los santos* de esta semana es de una carta de Pascua del obispo, San Atanasio:

"Cerca de nosotros está el Verbo que se hizo todo por nosotros, nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que promete permanecer siempre con nosotros. Él clama, diciendo: *Mirad, yo estoy con vosotros todos los días de este siglo...* Del mismo modo, ha venido entre nosotros como nuestra fiesta y día santo también... Fue Cristo quien iluminó el salmista mientras oraba: *Tú eres mi alegría, líbrame de los que me rodean.* El verdadero gozo, la fiesta genuina, significa echar fuera la maldad. Para lograrlo hay que vivir una vida de perfecta bondad y, en la serenidad del temor de Dios, practicar la contemplación en el corazón.

Este era el camino de los santos, quienes en su vida y en cada etapa de la vida se regocijaban como en una fiesta. El beato David, por ejemplo, no una sino siete veces se levantó de noche para ganar el favor de Dios a través de la oración. El gran Moisés estaba lleno de alegría mientras cantaba las alabanzas de Dios en himnos de victoria por la derrota del faraón y los opresores del pueblo hebreo. Otros tenían corazones siempre llenos de alegría mientras cumplían con su sagrado deber de adoración, como el gran Samuel y el bendito Elías. Debido a sus vidas santas ganaron la libertad, y ahora celebran una fiesta en el cielo. Se regocijan después de su peregrinaje en las sombras, y ahora distinguen la realidad de la promesa.

Cuando celebramos la fiesta en nuestro propio día, ¿qué camino debemos tomar? A medida que nos acercamos a esta fiesta, ¿quién será nuestro guía? Amado, no debe ser otro que aquel a quien te dirigirás conmigo como nuestro Señor Jesucristo...

En tiempos antiguos, la sangre de los machos cabríos y las cenizas de un becerro se rociaban sobre los inmundos, pero solo podían purificar el cuerpo. Ahora, por la gracia de la Palabra de Dios, todos quedan abundantemente limpios. Si seguimos de cerca a Cristo se nos permitirá, incluso en esta tierra, estar como en el umbral de la Jerusalén celestial y disfrutar de la contemplación de esa fiesta eterna, como los bienaventurados apóstoles, que siguiendo al Salvador como su guía , mostró, y aún muestra, el camino para obtener el mismo don de Dios. Ellos dijeron: Mira, hemos dejado todas las cosas y te hemos seguido. Nosotros también seguimos al Señor y celebramos su fiesta con obras más que con palabras".

Somos una Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unida en el gozo del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!

Lent is a liturgical season that focuses on the three pillars of prayer. fasting and almsgiving. The 40 days' journey of Lent begins from Ash Wednesday and ends with Holy week. Lent is a time for sacrifice and spiritual reflection preparing us for the joyful celebration of Easter Sunday.

A classical way of looking at the 40days of lent is consecrating our journey back to God and acknowledging that periodically we get off the track. But we got a person to show us the way- OUR LORD AND SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST who said " I am the way, the truth and the life" If we want to find our journey back to God is to go directly to Jesus who is the way.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) has an excellent way as it has become part of the tradition through RICEBOWL. That allows us to pray, it allows an act of sacrifice as we put in something at the RICE BOWL in the cost of giving up something, it allows us to do an act of love and service to charity to someone else.

Jesus said to Thomas, "you believe because you have seen me, blessed are those who have not seen, yet believe" (see John 20:29). Though we cannot see him, we know that he listens to us and he cares about us. All we need to do is to trust in him.

When we pray and trust in God who created and knows our every thought, our burdens become lighter. Prayer is not a way to avoid conflicts or stop disappointments; rather it helps us to manage our conflicts and disappointments gracefully, knowing that God is with us always and He will see us through those hard moments in our lives.

Prayer is the key to positive thinking and happiness. We feel some inner joy and peace knowing that God in whom we trust is watching over us, and he knows what is best for us. God is faithful even when we are unfaithful. Saint Paul in 1 Corinthians 10:13 encourages us to be strong in our faith and remember that God will not give us more than we can handle. So, no matter how hard and tough our lives may seem, by the grace of God, we have so much in us to overcome. Prayer truly helps us stay centered. Our prayer life will thrive only if we invest in it. Make time for prayer; commit to praying daily. Start small, maybe committing about ten minutes each day, and the Spirit of God will help it grow.

Dear Lord, please teach us how to pray and trust in you. Amen.
