Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

As Easter inches closer, we are encouraged to practice brotherly love, exemplified by Christ who, on the cross, forgave his persecutors. Our **Conversations with the Saints** series this week, which focuses on this theme is from the following exhortation by St. Aelred, an Abbott

"The perfection of brotherly love lies in the love of one's enemies. We can find no greater inspiration for this than grateful remembrance of the wonderful patience of Christ. He who is more fair than all the sons of men offered his fair face to be spat upon by sinful men; he allowed those eyes that rule the universe to be blindfolded by wicked men; he bared his back to the scourges; he submitted that head which strikes terror in principalities and powers to the sharpness of the thorns; he gave himself up to be mocked and reviled, and at the end endured the cross, the nails, the lance, the gall, the vinegar, remaining always gentle, meek and full of peace....

Who could listen to that wonderful prayer, so full of warmth, of love, of unshakeable serenity — *Father*, *forgive them* — and hesitate to embrace his enemies with overflowing love? *Father*, he says, *forgive them*. Is any gentleness, any love, lacking in this prayer?

Yet he put into it something more. It was not enough to pray for them: he wanted also to make excuses for them. *Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing*. They are great sinners, yes, but they have little judgment; therefore, *Father, forgive them*. They are nailing me to the cross, but they do not know who it is that they are nailing to the cross: *if they had known, they would never have crucified the Lord of glory; therefore, Father, forgive them*. They think it is a lawbreaker, an impostor claiming to be God, a seducer of the people. I have hidden my face from them, and they do not recognize my glory; therefore, *Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing*.

If someone wishes to love himself he must not allow himself to be corrupted by indulging his sinful nature. If he wishes to resist the promptings of his sinful nature he must enlarge the whole horizon of his love to contemplate the loving gentleness of the humanity of the Lord. Further, if he wishes to savor the joy of brotherly love with greater perfection and delight, he must extend even to his enemies the embrace of true love. But if he wishes to prevent this fire of divine love from growing cold because of injuries received, let him keep the eyes of his soul always fixed on the serene patience of his beloved Lord and Savior."

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Amados en Christo:

A medida que se acerca la Pascua, se nos anima a practicar el amor fraterno, ejemplificado por Cristo, quien, en la cruz, perdonó a sus perseguidores. Nuestra serie Conversaciones con los santos de esta semana, que se centra en este tema, proviene de la siguiente exhortación de San Aelred, un abad:

"La perfección del amor fraterno reside en el amor a los enemigos. No podemos encontrar mayor inspiración para esto que el recuerdo agradecido de la maravillosa paciencia de Cristo. El que es más hermoso que todos los hijos de los hombres ofreció su bello rostro para que los hombres pecadores lo escupieran; permitió que aquellos ojos que gobiernan el universo, fueran vendados por hombres malvados; desnudó su espalda a los flagelos; sometió a la agudeza de las espinas aquella cabeza que infunde terror en principados y potestades; se entregó a sí mismo para ser burlado e insultado, y al final soportó la cruz, los clavos, la lanza, la hiel, el vinagre, permaneciendo siempre manso, manso y lleno de paz....

¿Quién podría escuchar esa oración maravillosa, tan llena de calor, de amor, de inquebrantable serenidad —Padre, perdónalos— y vacilar en abrazar a sus enemigos con amor desbordante? Padre, dice, perdónalos. ¿Falta alguna mansedumbre, algún amor en esta oración?

Sin embargo, le puso algo más. No bastaba orar por ellos: quería también excusarse por ellos. Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen. Son grandes pecadores, sí, pero tienen poco juicio; por tanto, Padre, perdónalos. Me están clavando en la cruz, pero no saben a quién están clavando en la cruz: si lo hubieran sabido, nunca habrían crucificado al Señor de la gloria; por tanto, Padre, perdónalos. Piensan que es un transgresor de la ley, un impostor que dice ser Dios, un seductor de la gente. escondí de ellos mi rostro, y no reconocen mi gloria; por eso, Padre, perdónalos, porque no saben lo que hacen.

Si alguien quiere amarse a sí mismo, no debe dejarse corromper por complacer su naturaleza pecaminosa. Si quiere resistir a los impulsos de su naturaleza pecaminosa, debe ampliar todo el horizonte de su amor para contemplar la dulzura amorosa de la humanidad del Señor. Además, si quiere saborear la alegría del amor fraterno con mayor perfección y deleite, debe extender incluso a sus enemigos el abrazo del verdadero amor. Pero si quiere que este fuego del amor divino no se enfríe por las injurias recibidas, tenga siempre fijos los ojos de su alma en la serena paciencia de su amado Señor y Salvador."

FROM THE SERMON BY SAINT PETER CHRYSOLOGUS, BISHOP

Prayer knocks, fasting obtains, mercy receives.

There are three things, my brothers and sisters, by which faith stands firm, devotion remains constant, and virtue endures. They are prayer, fasting and mercy. Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives. Prayer, mercy and fasting: these three are one, and they give life to each other.

Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. Let no one try to separate them; they cannot be separated. If you have only one of them or not all together, you have nothing. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ears to others, you open God's ear to yourself. When you fast, see the fasting of others. If you want God to know that you are hungry, know that another is hungry. If you hope for mercy, show mercy. If you look for kindness, show kindness. If you want to receive, give. If you ask yourself what you deny to others, your asking is a mockery.

Let this be the pattern for all men when they practice mercy: show mercy to others in the same way, with the same generosity, with the same promptness, as you want others to show mercy to you.

Therefore, let prayer, mercy and fasting be one single plea to God on our behalf, one speech in our defence, a threefold united prayer in our favor. Let us use fasting to make up for what we have lost by despising others. Let us offer our souls in sacrifice by means of fasting. There is nothing more pleasing that we can offer to God, as the psalmist said in prophecy: A sacrifice to God is a broken spirit; God does not despise a bruised and humble heart. Offer your soul to God, make him an oblation of your fasting, so that your soul may be pure offering, a holy sacrifice, a living victim, remaining your own and at the same time made over to God. Whoever fails to give this to God will not be excused, for if you are to give him yourself you are never without the means of giving.

To make this acceptable, mercy must be added. Fasting bears, no fruit unless it is watered by mercy. Fasting dries up when mercy dries up. Mercy is to fasting as rain is to the earth. However much you may cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices; sow virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting, will bear no fruit. When you fast, if your mercy is thin your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gather in by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others.



IS CHRIST'S SUFFERING WORTH IT?

What would have been greater than the gift of God the Son for the redemption of humanity? He gave himself willingly even when he knew that it was not going to be easy for him. He also had a free will the same way we have our free wills though most times, we do not use them rightly. "Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will" (see Matthew 26:39).

It was not easy for Christ, but he still went ahead and submitted to the will of the Father for the sake of sinful humanity. All was done out of love. Love brought him to earth and for love, he suffered and died. "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). Yes, Christ's suffering is worth it because through his suffering and death, we have life. His was the one true sacrifice by which sinful humanity can be redeemed; and by his wounds, we are healed from our sins. Christ is the reason we can confidently call God, Father! Christ is our mediator with the Father.

Lord Jesus, My redeemer, I know I fail you everyday, forgetting all you endured in the hands of those you came to redeem in order to redeem them. Please forgive me. Good Jesus, at the heart of your suffering, you still showed mercy to the repentant thief, teaching me that your suffering was worth it. Your death indeed is the reason I am alive. Thank you. May I bear all my sufferings and the things that make me sad patiently, knowing that you bore your pain and suffering patiently for my sake. Amen.


