Dearly Beloved in Christ:

I began my seminary formation toward the priesthood in my home country Nigeria. The seminary I attended – the National Missionary Seminary of St. Paul – was located close to a teaching hospital. I quickly found out that the seminary community was a reliable source of blood donors for patients in the teaching hospital. Soon, I was enrolled as a regular blood donor, and felt privileged to be able to assist in this capacity, especially given the fact that I possess the rare O negative blood type.

Imagine my disappointment when I had gone to donate blood as a priest about ten years ago and I was told I could not give blood! The reason was because per the procedures set in place by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), folks – like me – who have lived in a malaria endemic area, are to be placed on a deferral period before they can give blood. I was disappointed, to say the least. Regrettably, my deferral period, per the FDA guidelines, will expire in 2025, at which time I will become eligible to donate blood.

I would like to encourage those who are capable to consider donating blood. Blood donors "give" life, as through their generosity many lives are saved. The Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center will be having a blood drive this **Friday, July 22nd** at the Galveston **Islamic Center** (902 Broadway Ave. Galveston, TX 77550), from 12:00PM to 4:30PM. See page 14 for more information and registration details.

The Christian virtues of hospitality and charity are emphasized in today's First Reading and Gospel. The First Reading presents us with Abraham's exemplary show of hospitality to three strangers. Not only was he blessed abundantly by these strangers who were actually angels, his act of kindness was exalted by the sacred author of the Letter to the Hebrews as an encouragement to us to be charitable: "Let mutual love continue. **Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels" (Hebrews 13:1-2).**

Hospitality has been described as choosing to provide a welcoming space for the stranger. Both Martha (in today's Gospel) and Abraham were blessed because they showed hospitality. May we take advantage of every opportunity that comes our way this week to be hospitable. And yes, giving blood – if one is able – is a form of hospitality to our neighbors.

Comencé mi formación en el seminario hacia el sacerdocio en mi país de origen, Nigeria. El seminario al que asistí, el Seminario Nacional Misionero de St. Paul, estaba ubicado cerca de un hospital universitario. Rápidamente descubrí que la comunidad del seminario era una fuente confiable de donantes de sangre para los pacientes del hospital escuela. Pronto, me inscribí como donante de sangre regular y me sentí privilegiado de poder ayudar en esta capacidad, especialmente dado que poseo el raro tipo de sangre O negativo.

ilmagínese mi decepción cuando fui a donar sangre como sacerdote hace unos diez años y me dijeron que no podía donar sangre! El motivo fue que, según los procedimientos establecidos por la Administración de Drogas y Alimentos de los EE. UU. (FDA), las personas, como yo, que han vivido en un área endémica de malaria, deben pasar por un período de aplazamiento antes de que puedan donar sangre. Me decepcionó, por decir lo menos. Lamentablemente, mi período de aplazamiento, según las pautas de la FDA, vencerá en 2025, momento en el cual seré elegible para donar sangre.

Me gustaría animar a aquellos que son capaces de considerar la posibilidad de donar sangre. Los donantes de sangre "dan" vida, ya que con su generosidad se salvan muchas vidas. El Centro Regional de Sangre de la Costa del Golfo realizará una campaña de donación de sangre este viernes 22 de julio en el Centro Islámico de Galveston (902 Broadway Ave. Galveston, TX 77550), de 12:00 p. m. a 4:30 p. m. Consulte la página 14 para obtener más información y detalles de registro.

Las virtudes cristianas de la hospitalidad y la caridad se enfatizan en la Primera Lectura y el Evangelio de hoy. who have Reached Catechetical Age. (7 years old or older)

This is a two-year program (process) for children who were not baptized as infants, who have attained the age of reason, are of catechetical age, and who will participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

The Children will attend weekly age- appropriate classes and parents will attend Sacrament Preparation Meetings periodically as required. The candidates will celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) at the Easter vigil of their second year.

The First year (stage) of the faith journey is called the inquiry. Classes are centered on God, and God's love. They cover basic questions in the areas of Catholic Belief, Mass, the Bible, saints, prayer, and practices. This is a time for inquires to learn the ways Catholics worship together and how they bring their Christian faith to life. This stage culminates with the commitment to enter the catechumenate, to prepare for entrance into full membership with the Catholic Church. The second year (stage) of classes emphasizes the child's relationship with God, and their families within the body of Christ, the Church. The process will continue with the Catechumenate, Lent and Mystagogy stages. A sponsor accompanies the child on his/her journey. All sponsors must fulfill Diocesan requirements.

Registration for first year (stage) requires to fill out registration form

Registration for second year, requires to fill out registration forms and bring a copy of your child's birth certificate.

During the two years, special sessions are held to help children, families, sponsors prepare for the celebration of the Sacraments of initiation, and parents are required to attend mandatory parent session and retreat.

The celebration of the Sacraments of initiation takes place during the Easter Vigil of the second year. The Candidates then begin a period of reflection on the initiation process called mystagogy where they reflect on the sacraments celebrated and continue to grow in their faith.
