Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Welcome to the holy season of Advent! Advent is to Christmas what Lent is to Easter; it is a time set aside for prayer and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord on Christmas day. To help us enter into the spirit of Advent, we will be having our **Annual Advent Retreat and Mission** from **Monday, November 28**th **to Wednesday, November 30**th. This year our focus will be on the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the source and font of our faith as Catholics. Please see the bulletin for more details.

Also, as it is now our custom, we will be resuming the **Conversations with the Saints** series, where each week (during Lent and Advent), we journey with the saints by meditating on their reflections about these holy seasons. This week we reflect on the following excerpts from the catechetical instructions given by St. Cyril of Jerusalem, on the twofold coming of Christ.

St. Cyril notes that "We do not preach only one coming of Christ, but a second as well, much more glorious than the first. The first coming was marked by patience; the second will bring the crown of a divine kingdom." Later, he went on to distinguish both comings by stating that "At the first coming he was wrapped in swaddling clothes in a manger. At his second coming he will be clothed in light as in a garment. In the first coming he endured the cross, despising the shame; in the second coming he will be in glory, escorted by an army of angels. We look then beyond the first coming and await the second."

To encourage us to make right preparations for the coming of our Savior, St. Cyril referenced the exhortation of St. Paul who also spoke of both comings of Christ: "These two comings are also referred to by Paul in writing to Titus: *The grace of God the Savior has appeared to all men, instructing us to put aside impiety and worldly desires and live temperately, uprightly, and religiously in this present age, waiting for the joyful hope, the appearance of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ.* Notice how he speaks of a first coming for which he gives thanks, and a second, the one we still await." May we prepare to receive the Lord with joyful vigilance not only at Christmas but always, for He comes to save!

We are one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Mensaje del Pastor

Amadísimos en Cristo:

¡Bienvenidos a la santa temporada de Adviento! el Adviento es a la Navidad lo que la Cuaresma es a la Pascua; es un tiempo destinado a la oración y preparación para la celebración de la Natividad del Señor el día de Navidad. Para ayudarnos a entrar en el espíritu de Adviento, tendremos nuestro **Retiro y Misión Anual de Adviento** del **lunes 28 de noviembre al miércoles 30 de noviembre**. Este año nuestro enfoque estará en el don de la **Sagrada Eucaristía**, la fuente y fuente de nuestra fe como católicos. Por favor vea el boletín para más detalles.

Además, como ya es nuestra costumbre, retomaremos la serie **Conversaciones con los Santos**, donde cada semana (durante la Cuaresma y el Adviento), caminamos con los santos meditando en sus reflexiones sobre estos tiempos santos. Esta semana reflexionamos sobre los siguientes extractos de las instrucciones catequísticas dadas por San Cirilo de Jerusalén, sobre la doble venida de Cristo.

San Cirilo señala que "No predicamos una sola venida de Cristo, sino también una segunda, mucho más gloriosa que la primera. La primera venida estuvo marcada por la paciencia; el segundo traerá la corona de un reino divino." Más tarde, pasó a distinguir ambas venidas al afirmar que "En la primera venida estaba envuelto en pañales en un pesebre. En su segunda venida será vestido de luz como de un manto. En la primera venida soportó la cruz, despreciando la vergüenza; en la segunda venida estará en gloria, escoltado por un ejército de ángeles. Miramos entonces más allá de la primera venida y esperamos la segunda".

Para animarnos a hacer los preparativos correctos para la venida de nuestro Salvador, San Cirilo hizo referencia a la exhortación de San Pablo, quien también habló de las dos venidas de Cristo: "Pablo también se refiere a estas dos venidas al escribir a Tito: La gracia de Dios Salvador se ha aparecido a todos los hombres, instruyéndonos a dejar a un lado la impiedad y los deseos mundanos, y vivir con sobriedad, rectitud y religiosidad en este siglo presente, esperando la gozosa esperanza, la manifestación de la gloria de nuestro gran Dios y Salvador, Jesucristo. Fíjate cómo habla de una primera venida por la que da gracias, y de una segunda, la que aún esperamos". ¡Que nos preparemos para recibir al Señor con gozosa vigilia no sólo en Navidad sino siempre, porque Él viene a salvar!

Somos una Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unida en el gozo del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!




