- Most importantly, it will present our parish as the growing, thriving and dynamic headquarters for Catholic worship, education and outreach that it is!

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Welcome to the Season of Lent! We are inviting everyone to our **Parish Lenten Retreat**, scheduled for **Monday, February 27 – Wednesday, March 1**st at **St. Mary's**.

As we have done in past years, we will continue with our **Conversations with the Saints** series throughout Lent. Below is a reflection on *Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving* by Saint Peter Chrysologus –

"There are three things, my brethren, by which faith stands firm, devotion remains constant, and virtue endures. They are prayer, fasting and mercy. Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives. Prayer, mercy and fasting: these three are one, and they give life to each other.

Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. Let no one try to separate them; they cannot be separated. If you have only one of them or not all together, you have nothing. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others you open God's ear to yourself.

When you fast, see the fasting of others. If you want God to know that you are hungry, know that another is hungry. If you hope for mercy, show mercy. If you look for kindness, show kindness. If you want to receive, give. If you ask for yourself what you deny to others, your asking is a mockery. ...

Fasting bears no fruit unless it is watered by mercy. Fasting dries up when mercy dries up. Mercy is to fasting as rain is to earth. However much you may cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, sow virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit.

When you fast, if your mercy is thin your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gather in by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others."

Amadísimos en Cristo:

¡Bienvenidos a la Temporada de Cuaresma! Estamos invitando a todos a nuestro Retiro Parroquial de Cuaresma, programado para el **lunes 27 de febrero - miércoles 1 de marzo en St. Mary's**.

Como lo hemos hecho en años anteriores, continuaremos con nuestra serie de **Conversaciones con los Santos** durante la Cuaresma. A continuación, una reflexión sobre la *oración, el ayuno y la limosna* de San Pedro Crisólogo:

"Hay tres cosas, hermanos míos, por las cuales la fe se mantiene firme, la devoción permanece constante y la virtud perdura. Son la oración, el ayuno y la misericordia. La oración llama a la puerta, el ayuno alcanza, la misericordia recibe. Oración, misericordia y ayuno: estos tres son uno, y se dan vida el uno al otro.

El ayuno es el alma de la oración, la misericordia es el alma del ayuno. Que nadie trate de separarlos; no se pueden separar. Si tienes solo uno de ellos o no todos juntos, no tienes nada. Así que si oras, ayuna; si ayunas, muestra misericordia; si quieres que tu petición sea escuchada, escucha la petición de los demás. Si no cierras tu oído a los demás, abres el oído de Dios a ti mismo.

Cuando ayunes, observa el ayuno de los demás. Si quieres que Dios sepa que tienes hambre, que sepas que otro tiene hambre. Si esperas misericordia, muestra misericordia. Si buscas bondad, muestra bondad. Si quieres recibir, da. Si pides para ti lo que niegas a los demás, tu petición es una burla. ...

El ayuno no da fruto a menos que sea regado por la misericordia. El ayuno se seca cuando se seca la misericordia. La misericordia es al ayuno como la lluvia a la tierra. Por mucho que cultives tu corazón, limpies el suelo de tu naturaleza, desarraigues los vicios, siembres virtudes, si no sueltas las fuentes de la misericordia, tu ayuno no dará fruto.

Cuando ayunas, si tu misericordia es escasa, tu cosecha será escasa; cuando ayunas, lo que viertes en misericordia se desborda en tu granero. Por tanto, no perdáis ahorrando, sino acumulad esparciendo. Da a los pobres, y te darás a ti mismo. No se te permitirá quedarte con lo que te has negado a dar a otros".

RCIA AND ADULT CONTINUING FAITH FORMATION




Registration for RCIA and for Adult Confirmation Classes are currently ongoing.




