#### Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Let us continue to journey through Lent with the saints as our guide through our *Conversations with the Saints* series; below are excerpts from a sermon given by St. Leo the Great on the Transfiguration –

<sup>7</sup> The Lord reveals his glory in the presence of chosen witnesses. His body is like that of the rest of mankind, but he makes it shine with such splendor that his face becomes like the sun in glory, and his garments as white as snow.

The great reason for this transfiguration was to remove the scandal of the cross from the hearts of his disciples, and to prevent the humiliation of his voluntary suffering from disturbing the faith of those who had witnessed the surpassing glory that lay concealed.

With no less forethought he was also providing a firm foundation for the hope of holy Church. The whole body of Christ was to understand the kind of transformation that it would receive as his gift. The members of that body were to look forward to a share in that glory which first blazed out in Christ their head.

The Lord had himself spoken of this when he foretold the splendor of his coming: Then the just will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Saint Paul the apostle bore witness to this same truth when he said: I consider that the sufferings of the present time are not to be compared with the future glory that is to be revealed in us. In another place he says: You are dead, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, your life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory....

In the preaching of the holy Gospel all should receive a strengthening of their faith. No one should be ashamed of the cross of Christ, through which the world has been redeemed. No one should fear to suffer for the sake of justice; no one should lose confidence in the reward that has been promised. The way to rest is through toil, the way to life is through death. Christ has taken on himself the whole weakness of our lowly human nature. If then we are steadfast in our faith in him and in our love for him, we win the victory that he has won, we receive what he has promised.

When it comes to obeying the commandments or enduring adversity, the words uttered by the Father should always echo in our ears: *This is my Son, the beloved, in whom I am well pleased; listen to him.*"

We are: one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

### Mensaje del Pastor

Queridísimos amados en Cristo;

Continuemos nuestra jornada de Cuaresma con los santos como nuestra guía a través de nuestra serie Conversaciones con los santos; a continuación, se encuentran extractos de un sermón dado por San León Magno sobre la Transfiguración:

<sup>7</sup>"El Señor puso de manifiesto su gloria ante los testigos que había elegido, e hizo resplandecer de tal manera aquel cuerpo suyo, semejante al de todos los hombres, que su rostro se volvió semejante a la claridad del sol y sus vestiduras aparecieron blancas como la nieve.

En aquella transfiguración se trataba, sobre todo, de alejar de los corazones de los discípulos el escándalo de la cruz, y evitar así que la humillación de la pasión voluntaria conturbara la fe de aquellos a quienes se había revelado la excelencia de la dignidad escondida.

Pero con no menor providencia se estaba fundamentando la esperanza de la Iglesia santa, ya que el cuerpo de Cristo, en su totalidad, podría comprender cuál habría de ser su transformación, y sus miembros podrían contar con la promesa de su participación en aquel honor que brillaba de antemano en la cabeza.

A propósito de lo cual había dicho el mismo Señor, al hablar de la majestad de su venida: Entonces los justos brillarán como el sol en el reino de su Padre. Cosa que el mismo apóstol Pablo corroboró, diciendo: Sostengo que los sufrimientos de ahora no pesan lo que la gloria que un día se nos descubrirá; y de nuevo: Habéis muerto, y vuestra vida está con Cristo escondida en Dios. Cuando aparezca Cristo, vida nuestra, entonces también vosotros apareceréis, juntamente con él, en gloria....

Que la predicación del santo Evangelio sirva, por tanto, para la confirmación de la fe de todos, y que nadie se avergüence de la cruz de Cristo, gracias a la cual el mundo ha sido redimido.

Que nadie tema sufrir por la justicia, ni desconfie del cumplimiento de las promesas, porque por el trabajo se va al descanso, y por la muerte se pasa a la vida; pues el Señor echó sobre sí toda la debilidad de nuestra condición, y, si nos mantenemos en su amor, venceremos lo que él venció y recibiremos lo que prometió.

Én efecto, ya se trate de cumplir los mandamientos o de tolerar las adversidades, nunca debe dejar de resonar en nuestros oídos la palabra pronunciada por el Padre: Éste es mi Hijo, el amado, mi predilecto; escuchadlo."

Somos: una Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unida en el gozo del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!

### Ways to Honor St Joseph in March

March is the month devoted to St. Joseph, patron saint of workers, families, homes, and a happy death. In the words of St. Thomas Aquinas, "Some saints are privileged to extend to us their patronage with particular efficacy in certain needs, but not in others; but our holy patron St. Joseph has the power to assist us in all cases, in every necessity, in every undertaking."

**For Your Special Intentions, Pray This Powerful Prayer to St. Joseph (**This prayer has never been known to fail. Make it one of your go-to prayers for you and your family and friends.)



#### PRAYER TO ST JOSEPH

Oh, St. Joseph, whose protection is so great, so prompt, so strong, before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires. Oh, St. Joseph, do assist me by your powerful intercession, and obtain for me from your Divine Son all spiritual blessings, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. So that, having engaged here below your heavenly power, I may offer my thanksgiving and homage to the most Loving of Fathers. Oh, St. Joseph, I never weary contemplating you and Jesus asleep in your arms; I dare not approach while He reposes near your heart. Press Him in my name and kiss His fine Head for me and Ask Him to return the Kiss when I draw my dying breath. St. Joseph, Patron of departed souls - pray for me. (Amen.)

This prayer was found in the fiftieth year of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. In 1505 it was sent from the Pope to Emperor Charles, when he was going into battle. Whoever shall read this prayer or hear it, or keep it about themselves, shall never die a sudden death or be drowned, nor shall poison take effect on them; neither shall they fall into the hands of the enemy, or shall be burned in any fire or shall be overpowered in any battle. Say for nine mornings in a row for anything you may desire. It has never been known to fail.

**Honor Your Father(s):** Any time in March but particularly on St. Joseph's Day, celebrate whatever older man in your life has guided you, deepened your faith or helped you - be it your biological father, adoptive father, foster father, spiritual leader/ father, grandfather, father-in-law, beloved uncle or good priest... honor them by praying for them and/or sending a card describing your gratitude or call then up, and/or offering a Mass in their honor. You may want to give them a holy card of St. Joseph.

**Offer Up Your Labor:** Out of love and gratitude for St. Joseph, offer up your labor, actions and deeds. Remember that keeping holy the Sabbath and abstaining from labor on Sunday honors St. Joseph as well as Our Lord.

**Place an Icon, Statue, or Image of St. Joseph on Your Table & Adorn It With Flowers:** And beside it, put a treasured picture of your own family as a way of seeking blessing and intercession for your family from St. Joseph, Pillar of Families. Decorate further with St. Joseph's Lily (a kind of amaryllis), or something similar such as Easter Lilies or a peace plant.

**Make Wednesdays Special:** According to Catholic tradition, Wednesday is the day of the week devoted to St. Joseph. Wednesday can be thought of as a linchpin in the week; on either side of it is a grouping of days, clustered together like an outstretched arm on either side. It is a perfect day to honor St. Joseph, whose arms were outstretched in life to comfort and protect Jesus and Mary. Make your Wednesdays extra special in March by going to Mass and/or asking for St. Joseph to pray for your intentions. You can find the St. Joseph devotion of the nine first Wednesdays on the internet.

**Read the "CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH," by Fr. Donald Calloway:** Listen to the Annabelle Moseley interview with Fr. Calloway speaking about the wonders of St. Joseph on the podcast: "Destination: Sainthood." You can find it on Apple Podcasts or iHeart or Podcast Addict. It is a little over 60 minutes long.

**Find Ways to Give:** Since St. Joseph is the patron saint of families, find ways to give to families in need through local or national Catholic organizations, such as food pantry or food distribution or soup kitchen, in St. Joseph's honor and following his loving example.

**Pray for the Suffering, Sick and Dying:** Since St. Joseph is the "Comfort to the Afflicted, Hope of the Sick, and the Patron of the Dying," ass these people to your daily prayers this month, in particular for those in Holy Family Parish here in Galveston. **At the End of the Day, Give Your Worries to the Sleeping St. Joseph:** It is said that St. Joseph frightens demons in his sleep, such is his power and strength. Ask St. Joseph, who communicates with God even in his dreams, to pray for your

intentions and take your worries so you can get some rest! Do as Pope Francis advises and place a note with your special intentions under a statue of the sleeping St. Joseph.

In the Spirit of the Eucharistic Revival, the Archdiocese has given permission to have the relics of two Eucharistic Saints tour the campus ministries across the Archdiocese. This is an effort to reach our young people.

Thus, the **Galveston-Newman Center** will have these first class relics on display at the Galveston Newman on **Tuesday, March 7<sup>th</sup>**, **2023 from 6:30-9:00 pm**. Preparations are being made to receive the relics with great reverence.

The relics are a bone from Saint Manuel Gonzalez Garcia, a Spanish Bishop who is known as the "Apostle of the Abandoned Tabernacle." He believed that no tabernacle should be abandoned. So much was his faith in this belief that he requested to be buried next to a tabernacle. He was the Bishop of Palencia, Spain.

The other relic is from a piece of Blessed Carlo Acutis's heart, a fragment of his pericardium. Blessed Carlo is known as the patron of the internet and of computer workers. He created a website of all the Eucharistic miracles in the world. Blessed Carlo is very popular with many young people today for zeal and holiness.
