Message from the Pastor

Mensaje del Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Welcome to the holy season of Lent! As we have done in previous years, we will be resuming on our *Conversations with the Saints* series, with the following reflections by St. Peter Chrysologus -

There are three things, my brethren, by which faith stands firm, devotion remains constant, and virtue endures. They are prayer, fasting and mercy. Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives. Prayer, mercy and fasting: these three are one, and they give life to each other.

Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. Let no one try to separate them; they cannot be separated. If you have only one of them or not all together, you have nothing. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others you open God's ear to yourself.

When you fast, see the fasting of others. If you want God to know that you are hungry, know that another is hungry. If you hope for mercy, show mercy. If you look for kindness, show kindness. If you want to receive, give. If you ask for yourself what you deny to others, your asking is a mockery....

Let us use fasting to make up for what we have lost by despising others. Let us offer our souls in sacrifice by means of fasting. There is nothing more pleasing that we can offer to God, as the psalmist said in prophecy: A sacrifice to God is a broken spirit; God does not despise a bruised and humbled heart.

To make these acceptable, mercy must be added. Fasting bears no fruit unless it is watered by mercy. Fasting dries up when mercy dries up. Mercy is to fasting as rain is to earth. However much you may cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, sow virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit....

When you fast, if your mercy is thin your harvest will be thin; when you fast, what you pour out in mercy overflows into your barn. Therefore, do not lose by saving, but gather in by scattering. Give to the poor, and you give to yourself. You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others."

Hermanos míos, hay tres cosas por las cuales la fe se mantiene firme, la devoción permanece constante y la virtud perdura. Son oración, ayuno y misericordia. La oración llama a la puerta, el ayuno obtiene, la misericordia recibe. Oración, misericordia y ayuno: estos tres son uno y se dan vida el uno al otro.

El ayuno es el alma de la oración, la misericordia es el alma del ayuno. Que nadie intente separarlos; no se pueden separar. Si tienes solo uno de ellos o no todos juntos, no tienes nada. Así que si oras, ayuna; si ayunas, ten misericordia; si quieres que tu petición sea escuchada, escucha la petición de los demás. Si no cierras el oído a los demás, abres el oído de Dios a ti mismo.

Cuando ayunes, observa el ayuno de los demás. Si quieres que Dios sepa que tienes hambre, debes saber que otro tiene hambre. Si esperas misericordia, muestra misericordia. Si buscas bondad, muestra bondad. Si quieres recibir, da. Si pides para ti lo que niegas a los demás. petición es una burla.... tu Utilicemos el ayuno para compensar lo que hemos perdido al despreciar a los demás. Ofrezcamos nuestras almas en sacrificio mediante el ayuno. No hay nada más agradable que podamos ofrecer a Dios, como dijo el salmista en profecía: Un sacrificio a Dios es un espíritu quebrantado; Dios no desprecia un corazón molido y humillado.

Para que esto sea aceptable, se debe agregar la misericordia. El ayuno no da fruto si no está regado por la misericordia. El ayuno se seca cuando se seca la misericordia. La misericordia es para el ayuno como la lluvia para la tierra. Por mucho que cultives tu corazón, limpies el suelo de tu naturaleza, desarraigues los vicios, siembres virtudes, si no sueltas los manantiales de la misericordia, tu ayuno no dará fruto....

Cuando ayunes, si tu misericordia es escasa, tu cosecha será escasa; cuando ayunas, lo que derramas en misericordia rebosa en tu granero. Por tanto, no perdáis ahorrando, sino juntad desparramando. Da a los pobres y te darás a ti mismo. No se te permitirá conservar lo que te has negado a dar a otros".




RCIA AND ADULT CONTINUING FAITH FORMATION



Eucharistic Miracle at Montserrat, Spain 1657

This grieving girl witnessed her father travel from purgatory to Heaven!

All because she had 3 Masses said for the repose of his soul......

During the 17th century, a grieving young girl approached Benedictine Abbot Miranda at the monastery of Our Lady of Montserrat. She begged the abbot to say three Masses for her deceased father.

The young girl was totally convinced that these Masses would speed her father on his way to Heaven, releasing him from the pains of purgatory. Moved by the

girl's child-like faith, the abbot said the first Mass, the next day. During the Mass the young girl was kneeling and as she looked up, she saw her father near the altar where the priest was saying the Mass. She described her father as "kneeling, surrounded by frightening flames" and located at the bottom step of the altar. The priest was alerted to this miraculous phenomenon and he instructed the girl to place a piece of tissue where her father was kneeling. The tissue immediately started on fire for all to see, though the priest could not see the child's father. This represented her father being purified by the flames of purgatory.

A second Mass was said for the father's soul and again the girl saw her father. This time "dressed in a colored suit" and no longer touched by the flames of purgatory. At the third Mass she saw her father for the last time. During the Eucharistic celebration he was "dressed in a snow-white suit,". At the end of the Mass the little girl exclaimed, "There is my father going away and rising into the sky!"

Parish Pastoral Council – Consejo Pastoral Parroquial Essential Esenciales

How does a pastoral council operate?

A council meets once a month with the pastor to consider pastoral issues. It listens carefully to the concerns of the pastor, the parish staff and others involved in the life of the parish. Through prayer and discernment, it searches for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to make recommendations to the pastor through consensus. A counselor position usually requires a couple of hours every week to follow-up on meeting agreements. Also, the council may have an annual retreat for prayer and reflection. Regular attendance at meetings is critical..





