Mensaje del Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Today's Gospel presents us with the beautiful vine imagery to describe the Body of Christ – that is, the Church. Christ is the Vine, God the Heavenly Father is the vine grower, and we are the branches. Unless we remain anchored to Christ, the Vine, we will not be able to bear fruit. Christ himself is emphatic with regards to this; he says to us: "without me you can do **nothing**"! (See: John 15:5; emphasis are mine).

This vine imagery has roots in the Old Testament where the chosen people of God were described as the vine of the Lord (See, for example, Isaiah 5:1-7 and Psalm 80:9-12). Christ, in applying this metaphor to himself, wants us to know that he is the one who truly constitutes the people of God, and that it is only through him that we gain access to the family of God. Therefore, our incorporation into the family of God is not based on ancestry but on a life of faith in Christ Jesus our Lord.

To be fruitful in life as disciples of Christ and members of the household of God, we must remain anchored in Christ: "Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me."

To remain in Christ is to let his word find a home in us; it is to be obedient to the commandments of God; and it involves a lifestyle that is nourished by prayer and works of charity. It is by living in this manner that we can lovingly welcome the 'pruning' of the Heavenly Father, the vine grower, who helps us to grow in maturity and bear fruit as his children in Christ.

Unless we *remain* in Christ, we will lose our way in life! In our First Reading today, we are presented with the figure of St. Paul who hitherto was persecuting the Church. Prior to his conversion, Paul was convinced of the rightness of his actions and decisions against the disciples. By the grace and mercy of God he experienced conversion in Christ and throughout the rest of his life and fruitful ministry, he strove to remain anchored in Christ. So united was Paul with Christ that he would say, "to me life is Christ, and death is gain" (Phil. 1:21). May these words of St. Paul be made visible through our lifestyle as disciples of Christ. Amen!

We are: one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

El Evangelio de hoy nos presenta las hermosas imágenes de la vid para describir el Cuerpo de Cristo, es decir, la Iglesia. Cristo es la Vid, Dios Padre Celestial es el viñador y nosotros somos los pámpanos. A menos que permanezcamos anclados a Cristo, la Vid, no podremos dar fruto. El mismo Cristo es enfático al respecto; nos dice: "jsin mí **nada** podéis hacer"! (Ver: Juan 15:5; el énfasis es mío).

Esta imagen de la vid tiene sus raíces en el Antiguo Testamento, donde el pueblo elegido de Dios era descrito como la vid del Señor (ver, por ejemplo, Isaías 5:1-7 y Salmo 80:9-12). Cristo, al aplicar esta metáfora a sí mismo, quiere que sepamos que él es quien verdaderamente constituye el pueblo de Dios, y que sólo a través de él accedemos a la familia de Dios. Por lo tanto, nuestra incorporación a la familia de Dios no se basa en la ascendencia sino en una vida de fe en Cristo Jesús nuestro Señor.

Para ser fructíferos en la vida como discípulos de Cristo y miembros de la familia de Dios, debemos permanecer anclados en Cristo: "Permaneced en mí, como yo permanezco en vosotros. Así como el pámpano no puede dar fruto por sí solo si no permanece en la vid, así tampoco vosotros si no permanecéis en mí".

Permanecer en Cristo es dejar que su palabra encuentre un hogar en nosotros; es ser obediente a los mandamientos de Dios; e implica un estilo de vida que se nutre de la oración y las obras de caridad. Viviendo de esta manera podemos acoger con amor la "poda" del Padre Celestial, el viñador, que nos ayuda a crecer en madurez y a dar frutos como hijos suyos en Cristo.

¡A menos que *permanezcamos* en Cristo, perderemos el rumbo en la vida! En nuestra Primera Lectura de hoy se nos presenta la figura de San Pablo que hasta entonces perseguía a la Iglesia. Antes de su conversión, Pablo estaba convencido de lo correcto de sus acciones y decisiones contra los discípulos. Por la gracia y misericordia de Dios experimentó la conversión en Cristo y durante el resto de su vida y ministerio fructífero, se esforzó por permanecer anclado en Cristo. Pablo estaba tan unido con Cristo que diría: "para mí la vida es Cristo, y la muerte es ganancia" (Fil. 1:21). Que estas palabras de San Pablo se hagan visibles a través de nuestro estilo de vida como discípulos de Cristo. ¡Amén!

Somos: una Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unida en el gozo del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros, jamén!




RCIA AND ADULT CONTINUING FAITH FORMATION
