Message from the Pastor

Mensaje del Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Christ our Lord and Savior offered himself as the eternal sacrifice, once and for all, for our redemption. Through his death on the cross he has redeemed mankind from the ravages of sin and death. This eternal and redemptive sacrifice of Christ is made present for us in the Holy Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that "When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, she commemorates Christ's Passover, and it is made present: **the sacrifice Christ offered once for all on the cross remains ever present**" (CCC 1364; emphasis added).

The following words are worth repeating! – the sacrifice Christ offered once for all on the cross remains ever present [in and through the Eucharist]! For, "As often as the sacrifice of the Cross by which 'Christ our Pasch has been sacrificed' is celebrated on the altar, the work of our redemption is carried out" (*Ibid*).

Therefore, each time we participate in the sacrifice of the Holy Eucharist, we are drawn into the saving sacrifice of Christ on the cross. This mystical reality is the work of God, given to his Church for our salvation. We who are privileged to participate in such divine mystery should not take the gift for granted. Rather, may our faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist be rekindled each day.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – Corpus Christi, let us commit ourselves once again to the reverent worship of the Holy Eucharist. This weekend in particular, we will join our brothers and sisters in a mile-long **solemn Eucharistic procession** from St. Mary's Cathedral Basilica to Sacred Heart church, followed by Eucharistic Exposition and adoration. This is part of the closing ceremony of the ongoing **National Eucharistic Revival**.

But our Eucharistic devotion should not stop with this 'special' celebration. Jesus is always present in the tabernacles in Catholic churches throughout the world, where he lovingly waits for us. I am delighted to announce that we are in the process of finalizing arrangements to have **Perpetual Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration** in our parish! We will be sharing more details with everyone as they become available. In the meantime, we will continue with our weekly Eucharistic Exposition from Tuesday morning to Wednesday evening. *Come, let us adore!*

We are: one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!

Cristo nuestro Señor y Salvador se ofreció a sí mismo como sacrificio eterno, de una vez por todas, para nuestra redención. Mediante su muerte en la cruz redimió a la humanidad de los estragos del pecado y de la muerte. Este sacrificio eterno y redentor de Cristo se hace presente para nosotros en la Sagrada Eucaristía. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos recuerda que "cuando la Iglesia celebra la Eucaristía, conmemora la Pascua de Cristo y ésta se hace presente: **el sacrificio que Cristo ofreció una vez para siempre en la cruz permanece siempre presente**" (CIC 1364; cursiva agregada).

¡Vale la pena repetir las siguientes palabras! – ¡el sacrificio que Cristo ofreció una vez para siempre en la cruz permanece siempre presente [en y a través de la Eucaristía]! Porque, "cuantas veces se celebra en el altar el sacrificio de la Cruz por el cual 'Cristo nuestra Pascua ha sido sacrificado', se realiza la obra de nuestra redención" (Ibíd.).

Por lo tanto, cada vez que participamos en el sacrificio de la Sagrada Eucaristía, somos atraídos al sacrificio salvador de Cristo en la cruz. Esta realidad mística es obra de Dios, entregada a su Iglesia para nuestra salvación. Nosotros, que tenemos el privilegio de participar en tal misterio divino, no debemos dar por sentado el regalo. Más bien, que nuestra fe en la presencia real de Cristo en la Eucaristía se reavive cada día.

Al celebrar la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo – Corpus Christi, comprometámonos una vez más al culto reverente de la Sagrada Eucaristía. Este fin de semana en particular, nos uniremos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas en una **solemne procesión eucarística** de una milla de largo desde la Catedral Basílica de Santa María hasta la iglesia del Sagrado Corazón, seguida de la Exposición Eucarística y la adoración. Esto es parte de la ceremonia de clausura del actual **Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional**.

Compartiremos más detalles con todos a medida que estén disponibles. Mientras tanto, continuaremos con nuestra Exposición Eucarística semanal desde el martes por la mañana hasta el miércoles por la noche. ¡*Venid, adoremos*!






