Message from the Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

The Holy Spirit, the Advocate, is the gift of the love of the Father and the Son to the Church. The Holy Spirit teaches and guides us in truth and love. We see this manifested in a special way in today's First Reading where the Apostles had to resolve matters of faith and morals in the early Christian community. In fact, today's First Reading recounts the first Ecumenical Council in the Church – the Council of Jerusalem.

An Ecumenical Council is an official gathering of the bishops and leaders in the Church to discuss and define matters of Christian doctrine, administration, and conduct. In the early Church, there existed a group known as the Judaizers who were insisting that Gentile converts must first become Jews before they can become Christians. The Judaizers were teaching that the new converts must follow the Jewish customs, particularly circumcision and strict adherence to the Mosaic Law, in order to be saved: "Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved," they insisted, in today's First Reading.

This was the doctrinal issue that the Jerusalem Council dealt with. The central issue here was the source of salvation, which we know is from Christ. In other words, our salvation is from Christ who died to redeem us. It is through our faith in Christ, characterized by a life that is centered on following him faithfully, that we are saved by the grace of God. Later on, St. Paul will confront the Judaizers (see Galatians 2 and 3), emphasizing Christ as the source of salvation, and our faith in him, characterized by a life of faithful discipleship, as the way to obtain the salvation he has won for us.

The actions of the Apostles and leaders in today's First Reading set the basis for future Ecumenical Councils in the Church. They manifest the exercise of the collegiality of the Bishops who share in the Apostolic succession. Most importantly, they remind us of the guiding presence of the Holy Spirit in the Church and of the mandate given by Christ to the Apostles and their successors to exercise authority in the matters of faith and morals (see: Matthew 16:19, 18:18).

We are: **one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!**

Mensaje del Pastor

Queridos amados en Cristo:

El Espíritu Santo, el Abogado, es el don del amor del Padre y del Hijo a la Iglesia. El Espíritu Santo nos enseña y nos guía en la verdad y el amor. Vemos esto manifestado de manera especial en la Primera Lectura de hoy, donde los Apóstoles tuvieron que resolver asuntos de fe y moral en la comunidad cristiana primitiva. De hecho, la Primera Lectura de hoy relata el primer Concilio Ecuménico de la Iglesia: el Concilio de Jerusalén.

Un Concilio Ecuménico es una reunión oficial de los obispos y líderes de la Iglesia para debatir y definir asuntos de doctrina, administración y conducta cristianas. En la Iglesia primitiva, existía un grupo conocido como los judaizantes, quienes insistían en que los gentiles conversos debían primero convertirse al judaísmo para poder convertirse al cristianismo. Los judaizantes enseñaban que los nuevos conversos debían seguir las costumbres judías, en particular la circuncisión y la estricta adhesión a la Ley Mosaica, para salvarse: «Si no se circuncidan según la práctica mosaica, no pueden salvarse», insistían en la Primera Lectura de hoy.

Esta fue la cuestión doctrinal que abordó el Concilio de Jerusalén. El tema central fue la fuente de la salvación, que sabemos proviene de Cristo. En otras palabras, nuestra salvación proviene de Cristo, quien murió para redimirnos. Es mediante nuestra fe en Cristo, caracterizada por una vida centrada en seguirlo fielmente, que somos salvos por la gracia de Dios. Más adelante, San Pablo confrontará a los judaizantes (véase Gálatas 2 y 3), enfatizando a Cristo como fuente de salvación y nuestra fe en él, caracterizada por una vida de fiel discipulado, como el camino para obtener la salvación que él nos ha ganado.

Las acciones de los apóstoles y líderes en la primera lectura de hoy sientan las bases para futuros concilios ecuménicos en la Iglesia. Manifiestan el ejercicio de la colegialidad de los obispos que comparten la sucesión apostólica. Lo más importante es que nos recuerdan la presencia orientadora del Espíritu Santo en la Iglesia y el mandato dado por Cristo a los Apóstoles y a sus sucesores de ejercer la autoridad en materia de fe y de moral (véase: Mateo 16:19, 18:18).

Somos: **una sola Parroquia de la Sagrada Familia, unidos en la alegría del Espíritu Santo y en la caridad, como discípulos misioneros. ¡Amén!**


