

Message from the Pastor

Mensaje del Pastor

Dearly Beloved in Christ:

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). Jesus, the Son of God who took our flesh so as to redeem us, has left us a memorial of his body and blood in the most Holy Eucharist. And so, the Church believes and firmly teaches that the Holy Eucharist is the true Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of our dearly beloved Savior, Jesus Christ, under the appearances of bread and wine. But how can this be?

Many have pondered this question throughout history. In the end, it comes down to faith and trust in God. When the Blessed Virgin Mary was visited by the angel Gabriel to share God's invitation to her to become the Mother of the Son of God, she too asked, *how can this be*? In response, she was invited by the angel to place her trust in God for Whom nothing will be impossible. Mary believed and for her faith in God, she was declared blessed.

Mary is our Mother and the model disciple. As her children, we too are called to surrender with faith to the mystery of the true presence of Jesus Christ in the most Holy Eucharist. The Holy Eucharist is the true Body and Blood of Christ because he says it is so. And we know that as God, nothing is impossible for him.

Just as Mary offered her *fiat*, her wholehearted "yes" in loving submission to God, we too are called to offer our *Amen* to the profound mystery of Christ's presence in the most Holy Eucharist. Let us approach this sacred gift with deep reverence and devotion. Reflect on the following:

- Prior to coming to Mass, spend some time in prayer and meditation over the readings of the day.
- Plan to arrive at Mass early and do NOT leave immediately after receiving the Holy Eucharist; rather, spend some time in prayer and adoration and wait for the final blessings.
- Receive the Lord worthily. If you have not been to confession in a while, now is a good time to do so. And remember to say "Amen!" with faith and reverence when the minister says, "The Body of Christ."

We are: one Holy Family Parish, united in the joy of the Holy Spirit and in charity, as missionary disciples, amen!





Misssa de Angelis

(The Missa de Angelis) has long been a favorite Gregorian setting of the Ordinary of the Mass. While the individual movements date well after the golden age of chant, their familiarity and enduring popularity over the centuries are beyond question, and this Mass setting is heard in Roman Catholic churches world-wide.
